PRESIDENTS REPORT

I'd like to start by saying thank you. Thank you to all our incredible volunteers who helped the club perform its duties from the beach to the board room and everywhere in between.

Congratulations to our club captain Keegan Clarke and the actives committee, who worked tirelessly all season to ensure patrol rosters were filled and our beach remained a safe place for friends and family. Despite the challenges that COVID-19 presented, you pushed on to ensure that the essential service of beach safety was maintained at our usual high level.

This year saw some new faces (and a couple of old ones) on the Board. This presents a challenge at any stage but worsened with the effects of COVID and the changing dynamics of the Club. I cannot thank the Board enough for their support and all the effort they have put into every aspect of the Club's smooth running. Many of the tasks are behind the scene, and have gone unnoticed but are not unappreciated. We are all volunteers and live busy lives outside the club, and our reward is seeing the club grow and evolve into a thriving destination for both members and the community. We have succeeded in providing an inclusive place for members, parents of members, holidaymakers and the community.

The newly refurbished social room proved to be a popular destination from the soft opening on boxing day. The vibe at the club was amazing, and over the course of the season, we were praised every day by guests. "Thank you" was the frequent message conveyed. "Thank you" for providing a space to unwind, with great views, good music, and chilled beverages and glowing sunsets. Of course, none of this would have been possible without our hard-working volunteers who returned day after day to vacuum, mop, stack dishes, restock etc. One person deserves a special mention, Cam Browne. Without Cam at the helm of the social room, none of this would have been achieved. As well as managing the social room, Cam also racked up 110.5 patrol hours. Cam manned the social room every evening from boxing day to Australia day- except for a week in isolation. Well done Cam; your hard work is very much appreciated.

The Board has been working closely with our new Councillors, the Mayor and the South Gippsland Shire CEO. We have had several meetings at the council offices, and CEO, Kerry Ellis, has taken the time to visit the club to help gain an understanding of our issues. Our first priority is to seek funding for a roof replacement. As we all know, the roof is in urgent need of attention.



PRESIDENTS REPORT CONT....

Quotes obtained some time ago suggest we need \$350,000; however, this may have increased given the recent rises in material and labour costs. Both council and LSV have advised that securing funding for facility improvements is not favourable at the moment, however, they will assist us in writing and applying for grants.

Aside from the facility improvements, we are striving for some direct community improvements such as sufficient lighting on the main public beach access path, council supplied bins near the boardwalk, the showers in front of the club reinstated, and the boardwalk widened to accommodate the high density of foot traffic and those with limited mobility.

As we all know, Sandy Point is a great little town, and being so compact means we may move about by alternative transport, e.g., bike, scooter, foot or even a skateboard. We encourage the use of alternative transport, and with this in mind, we need to ensure our roads are a safe place for users, including and especially children. As members of the community, I encourage you to have a say on the progress of this issue as it is complex and deserves consideration. We have voiced our concerns to the council and will continue to work with them and the SPCG to reach a suitable outcome.

At present we are waiting on a building permit for the construction of a 2-storey external amenity block for patrons visiting the social room facilities to use without entering the members' area. Members, parents, nippers etc., will mainly use the lower section. On the same application is the upper deck extension that has been held up due to BAL rating issues. We aim to have both of these tasks completed before the next season begins.

Looking to the future, we aim to extend the facility out to the east (towards the Prom). The extension will provide additional space for training purposes, allowing for training camps to run without interfering with patrolling members or the social room. We also expect that we will gain extra storage for equipment and vehicles on the ground floor and possibly a third bunk room for leaders/teachers.





PRESIDENTS REPORT CONT....

On New Year's Day we had the annual Current Cruiser swim. Conditions were favourable, the sun was shining and the wind was slight; however, we were missing one thing, Paul Minahan. Unfortunately, Paul had contracted COVID-19 and had one more day of isolation. I can't imagine how disappointed Paul must have felt, after all the planning, preparation and organising he has done over the past year, to miss the event by one day seemed cruel.

This year our membership has grown from 611 to 732, a fantastic achievement considering the impact of another year with COVID-19 interruptions. Nippers was once again a bonza season with 196 nippers enrolled, up from 161 last year. Special thanks to Natalie Ashdown for her dedication over the years as junior activities coordinator. Natalie stepped down at the end of the season and we are currently looking for a new coordinator.



Thank you to all our active members, you are all incredible. You have kept our beach safe all season. Waratah Beach is known for being family-friendly, however, we all know that can change in a flash and conditions can quickly become challenging. Once again, we have recorded zero fatalities and only a few minor incidents, you are all literally lifesavers.

event ran as smooth as could be expected with only a slight timing issue. A massive thank you to Paul for his enormous effort in organising the Current Cruiser. The Current Cruiser is our biggest single fundraiser event and is critical for the club's public profile with the community. FINANCE REPORT YEAR ENDING 30TH APRIL 2022

INTRODUCTION

The Club's financial position improved through the year, notwithstanding a significant refurbishment of the building inside and, to a lesser degree, outside, which provided greater amenities for members and the public. Due to hard work securing donors and sponsors when the clubhouse was built and the foresight of the Committee at the time, a building fund was created which provided the capital for these refurbishment works. The Board agreed that the profits from the Bar would go to reinstating that fund.

In addition to the refurbishment, significant maintenance was funded through Life Saving Victoria in the early part of the year by the previous Board.

Trading income increased compared to the previous year due to the progressive lifting of Covid19 restrictions and very importantly due to the activities of the bar in the Social Room.

Donations, grants and sponsorships continue to be a critical source of funding. Sponsorship was predominantly from the Current Cruiser event organised by Paul Minahan and Max Collins'. This event is well supported and promotes the Club in the community and has been dependent on the leadership and very substantial efforts of Paul for which the Board is grateful.

Nippers

The profit was \$3,845 greater than in the previous year, predominantly due to increased participation by 193 nippers, up from 161 in the previous year. In addition, the membership fees for all categories were restructured to reflect the benefits that people receive from their membership.



BAR

The Board committed to significant works prior to the season to renovate many parts of the Clubhouse including the social area. Cameron Browne managed the bar throughout the season and did enormous work to prepare, operate and clean up practically every weekend. Sincere thanks to all those who pitched with support.

Having the bar open provided great opportunities to connect for people who might otherwise not have spent time in and around the Clubhouse.

Financially the result has been extremely important for the Club with a significant improvement to cashflow, which made managing the accounts more straightforward than in the previous year. Price setting to achieve margins approaching commercial rates should be investigated by the next Board.

MARINE SEARCH & RESCUE (MSAR)

MSAR funding is based on 30th June financial year and the core funding since 2018/19 has been \$16,000 through Emergency Management Victoria (EMV).

During the year \$6400 of EMV funding was received to close out the previous funding year as well as \$16,000 for the 21/22 year. A Boating Safety Grant was received of which \$5794 was capitalised and therefore not shown below.

Life Saving Victoria recognises the value of the MSAR operation and the long term historical drain on the Club's finances. In the 20/21 year LSV arranged for an exception to the Victorian Emergency and Safety Equipment Program (VESEP) to treat MSAR as a separate entity, allowing the Club to effectively submit two applications. VESEP funding is based on each recipient providing one third of the funds. The Club are grateful to LSV for arranging 100% funding through the VESEP grant for a new Isuzu D-Max vehicle and two 60HP outboard motors for the RHIB.



NEISHA MCLEAN FUND

The Neisha McLean Memorial Fund Charter provides grants for the development of lifesavers. No funds were used or raised during the year.

The Board are pleased to advise that Neisha continues to be remembered for her outstanding contribution to the Club and in particular, her positive influence on others.

CLUB CAPTAINS REPORT

And just like that, the 2021/22 season is done and dusted. I would like to start this off by giving a huge thank you once again, to my wonderful Actives Committee. You guys have worked tirelessly through a challenging season, and it's been wonderful see all of you grow into leaders, and fantastic role models. There have been many challenges this season, but you guys as a team have shown resilience, drive, and passion to ensure that the club is performing to the best of its abilities. I would also like to thank the board for the endless work they put in to helping the club achieve bigger and better successes each year. I would finally like to personally thank every single one of you, because all of you as members are what makes this club amazing.

From the Nipper helpers, to those who are around to give advice and mentoring, those who clean up after everyone else, and to those who drive their kids down to Sandy. Thank you.

This season, we saw 5252.5 hours patrolled between the 27th of November 2021, and the 25th of April 2022. This has been our longest season yet, and the beach was busy right up to the end. These hours are up 33% on last year, as well as being the second most hours patrolled in one season in the last 10 years, only falling short by just 122 hours from 2017. During the patrolling period, we had a beach attendance of just over 9500, which is slightly up from last year, and I feel as though this number will continue to rise.



CLUB CAPTAINS REPORT CONT...

We effected 1871 preventative actions, undertook 8 minor first aids, with 0 major first aids and 0 rescues! This season, out lifesavers were increasingly proactive in holding and facilitating beach safe discussions with patrons. This increased level of proactivity is reflected in a 180% increase in the number of preventative actions from last year.

This season, we gained 40 new active, Bronze and SRC memberships, bringing our total count to 204 members. This is reflected in an overall growth in membership for this year, which grew 5%. We saw 15 members achieving over 100 volunteer patrol/water safety hours this season. On top of this, out of those 15, 5 of those are in their first season as a Bronzie.

Well done to all of you, it is a massive achievement; Sunday Doddrell*, Keegan Clarke, Claire Tremewen, Isabella Tremewen, Ally County*, Lucas Buckland*, Amala Liepa*, Daniel Osborn, Alyssa Clark, Oliver Wischer, Emily Wilson, Lucas Osborn, Cameron Browne, Hamish Fitzgerald*, and Amity Clarke.

This year, we had some huge patrol days, with the biggest being 34 people on patrol on the 26th of January. On this day, we also crowned a new Watermelon Eating Competition Champion, Thomas Murray. Taking a slightly different tack, we ran two very successful Bronze Camps this season, with the third being sadly cut short due to a COVID outbreak. Of the two that we ran, we put through around 34 kids, with 28 coming back to patrol.

One of the biggest successes this season was the Pink Zinc Patrol. This event was organised almost completely by Millie Hartung, Amy Jamieson, Claire Tremewen and Jade Wunderle. For these girls, this was their first time having such a big responsibility, and they took it on and owned it, doing an amazing job. The day started with breakfast in the social room with food donated by our members, which was followed by a paddle out behind the break. On this day the waves most certainly came to play, with some of the biggest waves I have seen in a couple of years. After this, the weekend featured an all-female run patrol, with females filling all 15 leadership positions. This is a huge achievement and one we as a club can be immensely proud of. I look forward to seeing this event be bigger and better in the years to come.

Another highlight for me this season was seeing really positive culture come back to the club. After coming off a COVID filled season last season, I was worried that some of what got me into lifesaving, such as playing games on and after patrol, building relationships, working as a team, and living with my mates, would be forgotten.

It has filled me with excitement, seeing so many younger members coming through the club and getting excited about the same things I did when I started. CHIEF INSTRUCTORS REPORT

The 2021/2022 season presented many challenges due to the changing situation of COVID-19. Our training and assessment team were consistently enthusiastic and put in many hours of hard work to contribute to well-run camps and courses.

A big thanks to our five assessors who conducted 10 individual skills maintenance sessions over the November/December/January period to ensure our club members were prepared for the patrolling season. This season, we were able to run the South Gippsland Secondary College Bronze camp, strengthening our relationship with the local community.

There were an additional two live-in Bronze Camps, seeing a further increase in interest. Unfortunately, one Bronze Medallion was not completed due to COVID-19. This was a monumental effort for our trainers to resume live-in camps after the previous season and the accommodation changes.

The annual surf rescue course was also a great success with our up-and-coming 13- and 14-year-olds. These courses would not be able to run without the awesome enthusiasm and adaptability of our volunteer trainers and water safety –thank you to everyone who contributed to our 2021/2022 volunteer training season.

Another highlight was the talk from Matt Momenturo from the Marine Mammal Foundation who introduced the Nippers to our marine environment and how to look after it.

Every year I am in awe of how early nerves at the beginning of the program turn into the confidence we see at the Club Championships, in such a short time – our program was just 8 sessions this year (we lost a session to the extreme weather) and most Nippers do not complete all the sessions. So to see the outstanding development of our Nippers in such a short time is a real credit to our Age Managers and Water Safety Team.

Our Age Managers brought a special combination of leadership, enthusiasm and friendly organisation skills and it is that combination that ensures the success of our program and the special vibe that we all feel.

MARINE SEARCH AND RESCUE (MSAR) REPORT

Despite COVID related disruptions the Waratah MSAR group had a successful season. There is no doubt that being in out of lockdowns, unwell and isolating crew members and state mandated protocols created challenges to accumulate training hours this season, but despite this, skippers and crews took every opportunity be on the water to hone skills and deliver an optimal service.



Training this season included many hours developing navigation and boat handling skills in a wide range of conditions that included low tide, strong winds, poor visibility, night-time as well as a changing bar at the entrance to the inlet. Other training exercises included boat launching and retrieval at Shallow Inlet and Walkerville, man overboard, navigation, bar crossing, towing and rafting and familiarisation around the islands of Wilsons Promontory and along Waratah Bay.

LSV arranged first aid training for the group to make sure this key proficiency was current, and all active crew and skippers took part in new mandatory sea survival exercises. Several members also took part in EMV facilitated crew development and radio operator courses. Towards the end of the season we had a crew take part in an EMV coordinated multi-agency search and rescue exercise in Corner Inlet off Welshpool.

Over the summer we had several call outs and happily none of these involved serious injuries. We located a missing kayaker off the Prom near the Glennies in very strong winds, towed back a fishing boat from Norman Island whose motor had caught fire on an overnight trip, recovered a jet ski in the inlet and dragged out a sunken boat from the inlet that had caught fire.

In the community Waratah Marine Rescue were active at the Current Cruiser, providing valuable support to the Waratah Beach Surf Life Saving Club by patrolling the course and keeping recreational craft in the inlet away from swimmers. And on Good Friday the Walkerville Walrus swimming group conducted their annual Walkerville to Waratah swim and the MSAR group kept close in case any assistance was required.



MSAR REPORT CONT...

From the annual EMV grant, plus a couple of business and community donations and support from LSV, we renovated the rescue base, installed a new state of the art navigation system, replaced motors, received a new ute (yet to be branded) and our expert local boat repairer and valued skipper, Doug Taylor, is getting close to completing 'Sinkalot', a purpose built vessel that allows recovery training on a simulated sunken ship that can fill with water and be purged as required.

As we progress towards season 2023, Waratah MSAR is entering a new phase with LSV changing the MSAR operating structure. Historically EMV have funded the LSV delivery of the MSAR service through WBSLSC, however in a recent change intended to reduce the organisational paperwork, compliance and financial burdens currently managed by volunteer skippers, crew and WBSLSC, LSV have announced they will coordinate MSAR centrally and take on responsibility for these functions.

This season we signed up several very committed and experienced trainee crew members who have put in a heap of time to gain familiarity with the service, quickly becoming valued members of the team. Cam has been involved in lifesaving at Waratah for 30 years, since joining back in 1992. During these 30 years, Cam has been involved in almost every single aspect of lifesaving, and in the 7 years I've known him he has been nothing but amazing. Cam has been awarded a 30 Year Long Service Award, as well as being one of 4 members at our club to receive the National Medal, which is given out to individuals who have attained over 30 volunteer patrol hours for 15 seasons. Surfguard only counts hours from 2008, but since then, Cam has racked up 806 volunteer patrol hours, achieving over 100 hours in 4 separate seasons. Cam has been the IRB Racing Team manager for the last 4 years, driving our boats to and from carnivals all over the state, organising people months in advance, and even this year when there were struggles with the IRB team, he still managed to motivate those in the leadership team and the team in general.

This year, Cam was asked to take on the role of Bar/Social Room Manager, as a volunteer. 
